1) "Increasing Japanese Industrial Competitiveness and the role in which IP should fill"

If Japanese companies try to show good leadership globally, it is important to put new technologies into business basis and use them effectively. In this panel discussion, panelists talked about how the present patent system should change adapting such a new trend from various perspectives.

2) "Strengthen industry-university cooperation and the role in which IP should fill"

To strengthen industry-university cooperation, various laws have enforced in last a few years and national universities will be made into independent administrative corporations in near future. In this panel discussion, panelists looked for the best way to reinvigorate industry-university cooperation in the new government-university order.
